Healthinfo4u Patient information

- Barriers to decision making
 - -uncertainty about the desire for participation
 - -the type of information needed
 - -problems of accessibility
 - -availability of suitable materials

- -all barriers can be overcome by re-purposing access to existing quality assured information
- -it is possible to use existing professional literature to provide the relevant content for the lay user and contribute to the development of the expert patient


Feedback Report


- 89% of respondents rated it "a good idea"
- 65.1% would use again rising to 81.5% after asking for and receiving articles
- 85% rated articles easy, moderate or understandable
- 59% said the articles fulfilled expectations with another 32% being fairly or partly satisfied
- 52% rated the information indispensable, valuable or significant with another 24% rating as helpful


Impressions after use

Healthinfo4u users who found their health topic immediately




Feedback Report

- Preference for free text search feature
 - just over 50% suggest
 it would be useful
 - no one variable associated with those comments
 - the free text search
 feature does not seem
 to affect comments on
 using the product again

• Full text or document supply

Chart 20. Expressed acceptance of postal delivery after site had been used



- 84 people requested 341 articles between them
- 5% full text in pilot 2
- 9.5% agreed from 2 publishers
- Maximum unlikely to exceed 20%
- 6% of document access was full-text


