is a web-based system that allows a library to manage a database of users and to request and/or provide documents to other libraries. Nilde is a National Research Counquest and/or pre cil (CNR) project.



Analysis of document exchange among BIBLIOSAN libraries and between BIBLIOSAN and other libraries over a one year period (May 2004 - April 2005)

IGHLIGHTS: The growing use of the service proves its success. Non BIBLIOSAN libraries play a very important role as suppliers of documents not owned by BIBLIOSAN libraries. he analysis of performance indicators (such as: total number of requested and supplied articles, document processing time, document fulfilment rate) highlights the low involvemen a limited number of libraries

IGHLIGHTS: Analysis of global exchanges through NILDE shows the important role played by bio-medical libraries. Bio-medical and technical-scientific libraries cover together 90% o otal document-exchange-rate. Cooperation is ne essary and crucial among different Institutions and in different scientific fields
