Oxford experience with One-to-one consultations

- Generic training gradually phased out
- Tailored workshops and individual sessions preferred
- One-to-one consultations very popular (in 2009 - 318 sessions by team of 6 librarians)
 Library training rooms
 - > Outreach in the wards/departments
- Follow ups / Ongoing support (mostly by electronic means)



Nurses publish more

- Career progression
 - Specialist nursing empowerment > Launch of very focused nursing titles (e.g. British journal of cardiac nursing)
- Research nursing evolvement
 Multidisciplinary teams
 Funding proposals
- Postgraduate dissertations / theses
- Encouragement by colleagues who have already published



Supporting nurses towards publication

- Suited to one-to-one consultations
- Beneficial to first-time authors
- Not a result of any promotional effort (regular users, word of mouth)
- De-mystifying the process of publication
- Encouraging the author
- Saving time and effort
