Introduction

- The need for health library services developed to support the various users continuously undergo changes^{1, 2, 3}
- Information science qualifications of the students, researchers and clinical staff, affects the quality of the conducted research and patient care⁴
- The number of systematic reviews published is increasing⁵





Introduction

Odense University hospital is one of four university hospitals in Denmark:

- The hospital covers more than
 35 medical specialties
- The hospital has to a great extent increased the number of professors and PhD students⁶:



Professors (2015): 94

PhD students (2015): 269

Professors (2009): 30

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Introduction

Odense University hospital is one of four university hospitals in Denmark:

Since 2012 four elite research centers have been established (centers focusing on being on the top of the international research league within their research area)



The number of peer reviewed publications has increased from 561 (2009) to 1203 (2015)⁶





Introduction

The medical library (Videncentret) located at the hospital is a close collaboration between University Library of Southern Denmark and the hospital.

The medical library supports:

- Clinical staff
- Students within the medical- and health related sciences
- Researchers at University of Southern Denmark and Odense University Hospital







Introduction

The medical library (Videncentret) located at the hospital is a close collaboration between University Library of Southern Denmark and the hospital.

- The increase in the number of researchers and research output indicate a call for differentiated health library services and support provided by the library
- The cornerstone in EBM, systematic reviews⁷, has augmented the need for literature searching skills







Among clinical staff, students and researchers the call for:

- Improved literature searching skills (both basic and systematic search levels)
- Reference management training
- Fast and easy accessible medical literature

Led to requisite changes in the organization of the medical library support and services





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Strategy

Despite changes in the organization of support and services, the medical library focused on the aim to promote and support research conducted at hospital.

Organizing differentiated library support services was necessary:

- To keep the library services and support updated
- To balance resources and the different needs of the students, researchers and clinical staff





- Previously, individual guidance in literature search of both pre- and postgraduate students, PhD students, researchers and clinical staff placed high demands on personnel resources.
- The services and support now offered depend on employment and academic level:
 - Researchers
 - Clinical staff (fast and easy available information)
 - PhD students
 - Students other than PhD students










The overall current services and support offered:







Knowledge, Rese Strategy

The current services and support offered:

- Introduction to literature search (workshops)
- Reference management training:
 - Endnote training sessions
 - Covidence training sessions
- Customized department web pages
- Specialized services





New services initiated:

Introduction to literature search (workshops)

- One-hour training sessions: train the attendees to search the most common health science databases (PubMed, Embase or CINAHL)
- Postgraduate students are offered brief individual guidance on literature searches in relation to their thesis
- The literature search workshops are offered approximately once a week (more often if needed)





New services initiated:

Reference management training

Endnote training sessions (initiated 2013):

- Basic one-hour training sessions (for beginners) with focus on introducing the most important functions in Endnote (offered approximately every second week, or more often if needed)
- An extended course (tips and tricks) developed to increase the competencies of existing Endnote users (offered once or twice a month)





New services initiated:

Reference management training:

Covidence training sessions (initiated 2016):

- One-hour basic training sessions, developed to support researchers doing systematic reviews
- Offered approximately once a month (more often if needed)





New services initiated:

Customized department web pages:

- Compile relevant resources in terms of journals, e-books and subject specialized resources
- The departments have a great impact on the content of their web page, and flexible solutions developed to meet the exact needs and requirements of the departments are provided





New services initiated:

Customized department web pages:

- Some departments have web pages customized for the different professions (e.g. nurses and doctors)
- Some departments have several customized web pages (e.g. Department of Clinical Pathology with sub specialties in skin or kidney pathology ect.)
- The Customized web pages are offered for all the departments at the hospital and are updated every half year

New services initiated:

Specialized services

- PhD students (and affiliated researchers) are offered individual guidance (1 1½ hr.) ensure a retained and specified support for those carrying out more detailed and systematic searches
- Clinical staff and researchers do have additional services available: conducted literature search, customized literature search course ect.



The reorganization of services and support reduce the time consumption of the previous individual trainings sessions.

- The availability of workshops and training sessions offer thorough introductions (regardless of academic level)
- The courses introduce a flexible offer on literature search and reference management introduction for all users



The reorganization of services and support reduce the time consumption:

Literature search workshops (Previously, individual guidance would have been offered to these attendees):

- 2016 (end of April): 100 attendees
- 2015: 202 attendees

Endnote training sessions:

- 2015: 199 attendees
- 2014: 174 attendees
- 2013: 213 attendees



New initiatives were necessary to meet the increased demands for literature search skills and reference management training guidance:

- The University of Southern Denmark offers PhD courses in Literature Search Strategies and Systematic Reviews with personnel from the Medical Library teaching and being wholly or partly responsible for these courses
- Introducing Covidence training relates to a new PhD course, which introduces Covidence as a tool for systematic reviews



New initiatives were necessary to meet the increased demands for literature search skills and reference management training guidance:

 The literature search workshops and reference management training offered in the medical library correlate to and fit the context of courses offered to PhD students (and others enrolled at PhD courses)



The reorganization of services and support reduce the time consumption:

Issues:

- Users that are no longer offered individual guidance in literature search (primarily postgraduate medical students), may be lacking this – especially if conducting a systematic review
- We have not yet carried out a satisfactory survey after the change in services and support





- A flexible and updated portfolio of introduction courses offered along with customized services contributes to the aim of supporting and promoting EBM
- Reorganizing the medical library support services to include general introduction courses, have helped us to assist more users, delivering specific, customized and complex support and training (often required by medical researchers)





Future perspectives

In order to keep the services and support updated following future initiatives may be considered:

- Providing e-learning courses
- Require the enrollment in a literature search / systematic review PhD course prior to individual guidance



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
