

Pushing for open access

Open Access Policy Alignment Strategies for European Union Research

Pasteur40A



A supporting tool

- to ensure OA to outputs of public-funded research
- to verify the alignment of OA policies with EC recommendations (H2020) and international good practices

In Italy, within Pasteur4 OA:

- 14 universities' policies investigated
- no study on biomedical research institutions' policies

ACTION NEEDED: exploration at national level (single EU member state) in the public health area

A paradigm shift expected in Italy



Scientific publications derived from studies which are at least 50% financed by the public must become open access within 18 months from the publication date.

Survey on **openness** within the **Italian National Health Service (NHS)**

Why a survey?

Because no data on OA strategies available until now

Which is the targeted audience?

• The 60 research institutions of the Italian NHS

Why a survey addressed to this audience?

 The institutions surveyed are the strongest producers of scientific literature within NHS

How to reach this audience?

 Through Bibliosan, the network of the Italian research institution libraries within NHS

Tool for conducting the survey

 Survey-monkey online questionnaire (open from 29 Feb to 4 Apr 2016)

Survey: topics covered

Establishment of an OA policy

Publication of a peer-reviewed official journal

Articles published in 2014 in OA journals with IF

Articles published in 2014 in hybrid journals with IF

Availability and access to published articles

Survey: respondents


32 institutions out of 60

26 out of 46 IRCCS (Scientific Institutes for Research, Hospitalization and Health Care)

4 out of 10 IZS (Veterinary Epidemiology Research Institutes)


2 out of 4 other bodies: Italian National Institute (ISS) and INAIL (National Institute for Insurance against Accidents at Work)

Survey: OA policy



- Only 2 institutions out of 32 declared that they issue their own policy (only 1 reported the URL to visualize the document)
- 1 institution declared that it is going to implement an OA policy
- 1 institution specified that it has only a policy to prevent malpractice (against predatory publishers)


Survey: Publication of a peer-reviewed official journal




2014: OA articles by the institutions in journals with IF


OA articles versus total published articles: 27%

- 19,4% articles in OA journals (15 respondents) +
- 7,6 OA articles in hybrid journals (7 respondents)






Survey: availability and access to published articles



Survey: conclusions

- The survey as a valuable tool for not only collecting data, but also to advocating open access among institutional decision makers
- Still poor awareness among Italian research biomedical institutions of the importance of open access to scientific research results
- Need to promote the ethical imperative to open science in the health field
