Sharing and reusing search blocks/strings in medical literature searching: Challenges for cooperation





2015: Workshop at EAHIL

- 23 participants
- More than 60 % of the participants reuse search blocks for common subjects, mainly in their own or local accounts
- All participants want to share more and in a better way

2016: Survey among 9 moderators of blogs/sites for sharing search blocks







Strengths (1)





- Coverage: good range of searches different databases/interfaces comprehensive international coverage
- Access: open to anyone
- Quality: innovative, some consistency

Strengths (2)

Design: easy to use

Weaknesses (1)

- Coverage: range of topics still limited,
 not adapted to various databases
- Format: not standardized
- Functionality: feedback missing
- Quality: consistency is varying update needed

Weaknesses (2)

JUNTA DE ANDALUCIA CONSEJERÍA DE SALUD




- Access: site is hidden or difficult to find
- Use: no idea of reuse
- Time constraint for further development
- Design: poor
