

Finding out more about Cardiff and Wales? Look no further than History Points.

As you are walking about Cardiff when you are not working hard at the conference of course, and for anyone taking a holiday in Wales following the conference you will find History Points a great help.

History Points is an invention created by Rhodri Clark in 2012 as an experiment in using mobile phone technology to give people short packages of historical information on the spot, as they pass or visit buildings, memorials and other places of interest.

All you need to do is to scan the QR codes on windows, fences, doors, walls, gateposts and notice boards at more than 1,000 places across Wales.

You will then see a concise history of the object before you or the place you are at.

History Points works with the Royal National Institute for the Blind RNIB to provide audio readings of some of the pages.
